Source: TechCrunch A new report has revealed Facebook plans to overhaul its Messenger app. As TechCrunch reported: Chatbots were central to Facebook Messenger's strategy three years ago. Now they are hidden from the view of the app along with games and business. Facebook Messenger is now removing discover tabs as it focuses on speed and simplicity instead of extensive utilities like WeChat in China. The changes are part of a larger messenger redesign that will re-turn the People tab around the story as Facebook continues to try to dominate the temporary social media format it copied from Snapchat. The Users tab defaults to the full-screen subtabs in Friends Stories, and you'll need to tap the Active subtab to see which friends are currently online. The change seems to give users more time to talk to friends and watch content rather than talking in chatbots, businesses or games. The Discover tab is displayed, and the only tabs that appear are Chat and People. The user has two subtabs: one for the story and one for the active tab. According to the report, a Facebook spokesperson confirmed that the redesign will begin deployment soon, and some may have already updated it. More rollouts are planned this week. Facebook said it would deliver on its promise to get rid of Discover in August. Features such as chatbots, businesses and games are hidden, but now you have to deliberately search them in the Messenger search bar to find them. The update seems to suggest that Facebook is pushing Messenger in WhatsApp's direction to become a streamlined and focused messenger service rather than a do-it-all utility app like WeChat in China.
